Paper requirements

- **Length:** 8 to 12-page paper
- **Topic:** An application of coastal engineering principles and practices, preferably in Alaska or in other cold regions
 - A topic of sincere interest to you is best
 - Explain the issues and challenges to your graduate student colleagues and to the undergraduates who will be reading your paper
 - Practical case studies are great, as long as a review of pertinent literature is included
 - The context is an engineering conference, so consider similar depth and detail
 - Look at any ASCE conference proceedings (papers) to judge depth and detail
 - Don't publish your MS thesis; that's too deep and too much detail; maybe one part of your thesis project would work, however
- **Format:** Follow ASCE conference paper guidelines, including citation and reference list formats
 - Cite appropriate references in the text and reference list
 - Cite source of graphics, unless figure or photo is your completely original work
 - Cite source of data in tables or otherwise presented
 - You may consider submitting your paper to an actual society conference
